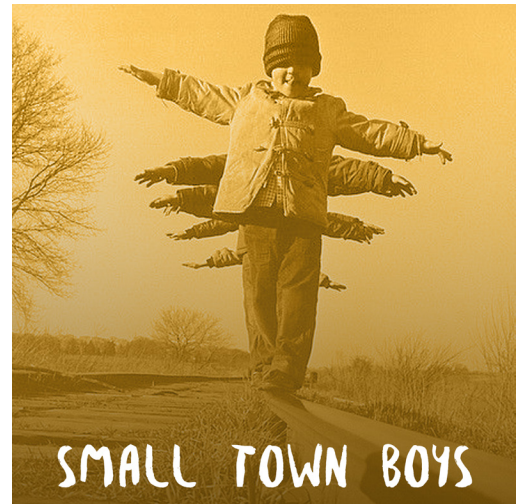


A devastatingly beautiful story...

Small Town Boys is riveting, fierce, equally tender and punch in the gut tough, absolutely hilarious! It is a big hearted play about brotherhood, about human triumphs and failings, about the hands we are dealt in life, and the choices we make, and their consequences.

Through the language and actions of 17 different characters, Sean Casey LeClaire amplifies an entertaining coming-of-age story. The scene with his biology teacher and one of his two best friends Big Willy is priceless, a timely “testosterone wash!”

Though *Small Town Boys* proves that “no man is born violent,” it also demonstrates, with both wit and tenderness, why men can and do behave violently, towards others and themselves. The characters come from a small town near Montreal and are charmingly Canadian, but the stories are so universal that they could have arisen from any North American town, from Sarasota to Santa Rosa to Saskatoon. Those who see this play will be moved in spirit, opened in mind, and a bit churned in the gut.
